Each People is a group of 10 Famílies, and each Family is made up of 25 Masai warriors, you.

The Family is the base unit of the Masai Nation, and each warrior is expected to play their role within it with pride and authenticity, and thus fully live this journey.

Within the Family you'll find other warriors, who will become true brothers and sisters to you. After all the adventures and challenges you'll face, we're sure lifelong friendships will emerge.

What to bring?



Here you'll find the list of items each Rover should bring.

Read it carefully to make sure you have in your backpack everything you need for this magical week in Terras da Felicidade.

Individual Items:

- Uniform (you should wear it when you arrive at camp, when you leave camp in the last day and during the religious ceremonies);
- Sleeping bag and mattress;
- Flashlight;
- Canteen (plate, fork, spoon, knife, mug and reusable water bottle/ flask);
- Box for carrying food (aka Tupperware);
- Hygiene kit and showering/bathing supplies;
- Beach towel, flip flops and bathing suit;
- Water shoes (or old sneakers) for water activities;
- Individual first aid kit:
- Sunscreen and hat/ cap;
- Old clothes that can get dirty (for Service activities and Adventure Camp);
- Colored necklace (preferred) or bracelet;
- Protective gear for your personal belongings (waterproof cell phone pouch, eyewear protection, etc) optional;
- Electrical extension cord (for charging) optional;
- Powerbank optional;
- Insect repellent optional.

Besides this, each family (group of 25 people) must bring:

- Tents for all (separated by gender and leaders separated from Rovers);
- Awnings and/or shade nets;
- Sisal;
- Kitchen supplies (enough to cook for a Family):
 - Water jug (20 L min.);
 - Min. of 2 stove burners:
 - Gas canister (compatible with the stove);
 - 2 ABC Chemical Powder Extinguishers and fire blanket;



- Cooking gear (pots/pan, frying pan, kettle, kitchen knives, wooden spoons, serving utensils);



Challenge


Because we're reaching the final countdown, it's time to present you with a challenge.

As in any journey that a warrior accepts as their own, preparation is essential and sometimes challenging, as becoming aware of the baggage one carries takes place in the mind of those who embrace a new challenge.

In their knapsack, the warriors carry the tools that will help them overcome all obstacles and enjoy the beauty of the path the best way possible. In their mind, they carry experiences and establish roots that give them resilience and help them reach their goals and to never give up. These are their roots, solid foundations of their family and clan, which allow them to build themselves.

And it is the roots of your clan/ Rover crew that now become a challenge. In your baggage,

you must materialize where you come from, what unites you and what identifies you. We ask that, per clan/ crew, you bring a circular wooden crown with the dimensions indicated below:





You should customize this representation as you see fit, noting that only the surrounding strip (1.5 cm high) will be visible, that the inner cut should not be obstructed, and that the entire piece cannot exceed the indicated height of 1,5 cm.

Materialize your bases so that you can enjoy everything that arises from this representation.

This is just the beginning of something that we will build as warriors, families and people of the great Masai Nation.
